ANT 151 Introduction to Genealogical Research

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course provides an overview of the principles, ethics and technology utilized to conduct a personal genealogical search. Students will learn ethical best practices, establish a genealogical proof standard, employ and execute basic search techniques and exhibit an understanding of genealogical records associated with the research process.

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, the student will demonstrate:

1. Techniques used in searching historical records.
2. How to use the library and other resources in your research.
3. What technology and materials are available to assist you research.
4. How to use clues from your present to link to your past.
