COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course provides a review and preparation for students in the various methods of assessment for certification. Practice in this course includes the application of voice to sign and sign to voice skills gained from prerequisite courses which introduced interpreting from simulated situations.

PREREQUISITE: ASL 225

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon successful completion of the course, the student will:

- Develop various methods of assessment for certification
- Develop application of voice-to-sign and sign-to-voice skills
- Demonstrate in-depth synthesis of voice-to-sign/sign-to-voice skills in both interpreting and transliterating
- Show advanced interpreting skills in various and specialized settings such as team interpreting, video relay, and sight interpreting
- Move toward preparation for state certification examinations for professional interpreting

ASSESSMENT METHODS:
