COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is a supervised work experience in a law enforcement setting with emphasis on the development of positive interpersonal skills. Students must maintain a log and written reports of their field activities.

PREREQUISITES: CJS 100 and LEA 201 COREQUISITE: LEA 225

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Describe and design a community policing initiative
- 2. Distinguish the roles of various law enforcement agencies, city, county, state and federal
- 3. Describe crime trends and enforcement strategies within targeted communities
- 4. Demonstrate the use and effectiveness of crime mapping
- 5. Explain the importance of community partnerships
- 6. Demonstrate enhanced interpersonal skills
