COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course covers aspects of Muslim world civilization, including art, music, philosophy, literature, science and architecture.

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, the student will be familiar with:

- Understanding the basic sources which constitute the foundation of Islamic civilization
- Understanding geographical expansion and contractions that took place between 632-1492
- Understanding the literary, material, and scientific contribution that Islamic civilization made to world civilization
- Understanding the important interactions that took place between Islamic civilization and the West in Spain between 711-1492
- Understanding how we see the world in which we live is shaped by historical factors
