COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is an examination of America's democracy, its principles, processes and political institutions. Emphasis is placed on the functioning of the national government and the making of public policy.

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon successful completion of the course the student will:

- 1. Analyze the major theories of government
- 2. Analyze the major theories of democracy
- 3. Examine the historical roots of the U.S. Constitution
- 4. Explain the basic structure and operation of the U.S. government
- 5. Analyze the role of interest groups in the American political system
- 6. Analyze the role of public opinion in the U.S. government
- 7. Explain the process of political socialization in the U.S
- 8. Examine the role of political parties in the American political system
- 9. Evaluate the role of the president in the American political system
- 10. Evaluate the role of the congress in the American political system
- 11. Evaluate the role of the judiciary in the American political system
- 12. Analyze the development and current applications of Civil Rights and Civil Liberties in the U.S.

ASSESSMENT METHODS:
