

Fire Suppression Training

The Michigan Institute for Public Safety Education (MIPSE) at Wayne County Community College District is able to train fire fighters, structural fire brigade and industrial incipient fire responders with the most up-to-date fire suppression techniques via the use of its fire suppression simulators, including:

Aircraft – This 45-foot trainer offers real life training for fuel spills and fire suppression for emergencies related to aircraft and air travel.

Burn Room – The burn room gives fire fighters the opportunity to enter a smoke-filled room where the temperature can reach 500 degrees, and allows them to feel the changing dynamics of the room when water is put on a fire. The burn room can provide room and content-fire experiences.

Shipboard – Disasters in the water offer unique challenges. With a 48-by-8-foot marine trainer, participants can practice vessel search and rescue, catastrophic event response, fire suppression, victim extrication and anti-terrorism techniques for safeguarding ports.

Vehicle – This trainer offers a realistic setting to practice emergency roadside maneuvers for accident-scene fire suppression and fuel spills.
